INTRODUCTION

The climate crisis presents us with immense challenges. Its effects go far beyond the ecological foundations of life. Environmental crises, global migration movements, conflicts over scarce resources and economic slumps can lead to a permanent emergency regime with far-reaching encroachments on basic democratic rights and our everyday lives.

The urgency of the problem and the short window of opportunity for effective action are already intensifying the debate about appropriate responses to climate change. While some are in favour of drastic state intervention and restrictions, others are looking for a strategy that combines climate protection with liberal democracy and a market economy.

At the same time, politics and society are facing other urgent challenges: Russia's war of aggression in Ukraine, war in the Middle East, rising prices, housing shortages and increasing conflicts over migration. Climate policy is slipping down the political priority scale and in public perception. The recent ruling by the Federal Constitutional Court on the Climate and Transformation Fund adds to the pressure.

How can climate policy get back on the offensive? What can a liberal climate policy look like, how can it be implemented in practice? What strategies and concepts, what narratives are needed for this?

The conference offers a platform for an open discussion on the tense relationship between liberalism and ecology, climate protection and freedom: What are the alternatives to drastic restrictions and bans, how can a dynamic of ecological investment and innovation be unleashed, what role can and should science play and what regulatory framework conditions are needed for a successful ecological transformation?
